1. <u>Minutes of the last meeting of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee</u> – confirmation of.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee confirmed the minutes of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee meeting held on 19/07/2018.

2. <u>Minutes of the last meeting of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee</u> – action taken thereon.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee noted that the approval from the Oversight Committee is awaited and action taken on the minutes of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee meeting 19/07/2018 will be taken after approval from the Oversight Committee.

3. <u>Dr. Chandramohan K. V/S Regional Cancer Centre &Ors. - Writ Petition</u> (Civil) No 19248 of Year 2017 in the Hon'ble Kerala High Court at Ernakulam

Read: the letter dated 18.06.2018 received from Sh. Titus Mani Vettom, Standing Counsel of Medical Council of India in the Hon'ble Kerala High Court at Ernakulam along with the order dated 08.06.2018 passed by the Hon'ble High Court with regard to Writ Petition (Civil) No 19248 of Year 2017 in Dr. Chandramohan K. V/S Regional Cancer Centre & Ors. in the Hon'ble Kerala High Court at Ernakulam and the opinion of the Law Officer.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the letter dated 18.06.2018 received from Sh. Titus Mani Vettom, Standing Counsel of Medical Council of India in the Hon'ble Kerala High Court at Ernakulam along with the order dated 08.06.2018 passed by the Hon'ble High Court with regard to Writ Petition (Civil) No 19248 of Year 2017 in Dr. Chandramohan K. V/S Regional Cancer Centre & Ors. in the Hon'ble Kerala High Court at Ernakulam and the opinion of the Law Officer and noted that neither Exhibit P-1 nor R-3(b) are attached with the agenda without which it cannot be known that what is the difference between the two. As per the order of the Hon'ble High Court a personal hearing is also to be given to both the parties. The Committee decided to ask the section to place the item with all relevant documents and also request both the parties to be present on the day of the next meeting of the PG Committee for hearing.

The minutes of the above item were read out, approved and confirmed in the meeting itself.

4. Amendment in PGMER, 2000 for animal experimentation in PG Courses – Reg.

Read: the matter with regard to Amendment in PGMER, 2000 for animal experimentation in PG Courses along with the letter dated 21/06/2018 received from the Under Secretary to the Govt. of India, Ministry of Health & FW, New Delhi.

In view of Ministry Letter dated 05.06.2018, the entire issue should be reexamined by the office. If animal physiology laboratory is an essential infrastructural requirement in the department of Physiology, where is the need for inserting the proposed clause in the regulations. The academic Committee has recommended that animal experimentation should continue to be a part of PG curriculum in Physiology and Pharmacology in Medical Colleges which is already there. For what purpose the amendment was proposed. The office to clarify and bring the item again.

5. <u>Proposal for inclusion of MD(Laboratory Medicine) in PG Medical Education</u> Regulations, 2000 – reg.

Read: the matter with regard to proposal for inclusion of MD(Laboratory medicine) in PG Medical Education Regulations, 2000 alongwith the report of Expert Committee and Sub-Committee.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the matter with regard to proposal for inclusion of MD(Laboratory medicine) in PG Medical Education Regulations, 2000 alongwith the report of Expert Committee and the recommendations of the Sub-Committee and decided to approve/accept the report. The report of Expert Committee is reproduced below:-

"The Expert Committee meeting was held on 20.03.2018 at 2.30 p.m. regarding "proposal for inclusion of MD(Laboratory Medicine) in Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000" The Committee made the following observations:

Three MD courses namely Microbiology Pathology and Biochemistry are already running in all medical colleges as recognized qualifications. The Committee does not see any justification to starting a combination course which will have a substantially overlapping curriculum with these subjects Independent postgraduate courses in Microbiology, Pathology and Biochemistry were initiated owing to their increasing scope, syllabus and workload. These subjects are so vast and voluminous that merging their curriculum under one subject of "Laboratory Medicine" would be against the very reason for initiating independent MD course in them. Moreover, laboratory training is already a part of the syllabus of postgraduate qualification in the above mentioned three subjects namely, Microbiology, Pathology and Biochemistry. If the course (MD Laboratory Medicine) is included in Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, it will create a lot of confusion regarding eligibility of candidates with a MD Laboratory Medicine degree for the filling up the posts of Assistant Professor in the already existing streams of MD Microbiology, Pathology & Biochemistry. Therefore, the Committee members feel that "MD Laboratory Medicine" should not be included in the post Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000."

6. Regarding the recognition of DDVL at Stanley Medical College, Chennai.

Read: the considered the letter dated 12/10/2017 received from Dr. Jintu Philip & Dr. D. Rajesh, DDVL Students (May, 2015 – May, 2017), Govt. Stanley Medical College, Chennai with regard to recognition of DDVL at Stanley Medical College, Chennai along with the legal opinion dated 23.06.2018.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the considered the letter dated 12/10/2017 received from Dr. Jintu Philip & Dr. D. Rajesh, DDVL Students (May, 2015 – May, 2017), Govt. Stanley Medical College, Chennai with regard to recognition of DDVL at Stanley Medical College, Chennai along with the legal opinion dated 23.06.2018 of the Law office, which is reproduced as under:-

"The file of PG Section of Diploma in DVL of Stanley Medical College has been referred for my opinion. On perusal of file following facts emerge:-

Firstly, it is stated on the website of the MCI that Diploma in DVL course is recognized for 02 seats. and admissions in this course has been stopped w.e.f. 26.10.13 by the Council. File records do not indicate the reason as to why such course has stopped.

Secondly, the Medical College has stated its letter dated 28.06.17 that from 2016-17 and 2017-18 they have not made any admissions.

Thirdly, vide letter dated 25.10.17 Council has conveyed to the College authorities that the admissions that have made have been

accepted and had withdrawn the discharge notice in respect of two candidates admitted in 2015-16 batch. It was also directed that the Institute should not make any further admissions.

Fourthly, vide Council letter dated 24.08.17 and reminder dated 29.11.17 the Institute has been asked to seek renewal of recognition.

From the above factual matrix, it is seen that the decision of erstwhile Board of Governors in super-session of the Medical Council of India had been conveyed on 26.10.13 directing

the Institute to stop admissions. There was no recommendation made to the Central Government for withdrawal of recognition. Thus, the course as on date remains recognized. In view of categorical submission made by College authorities it stands discontinued from academic year 2016-17 onwards.

Further, I am of the view that the renewal of recognition in view of discontinuance of course by the College Authorities is not required to be further pursued by the Council office."

The Postgraduate Committee decided to accept the above legal opinion.

7. Rejoining the Course after 8 years by Dimple Bhatti, MD (Obst. & Gynecology) of Christian Medical College, Ludhiana – Regarding.

Read: the letter dated 17.04.2018 received from the Vice-Chancellor, Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, Faridkot and letter dated 27.04.2018 received from Dr. Dimple Bhatti with regard to Rejoining the Course after 8 years by Dimple Bhatti, MD (Obst. & Gynecology) of Christian Medical College, Ludhiana along with the decision of the Sub-Committee dated 29/05/2018.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the letter dated 17.04.2018 received from the Vice-Chancellor, Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, Faridkot and letter dated 27.04.2018 received from Dr. Dimple Bhatti with regard to Rejoining the Course after 8 years by Dimple Bhatti, MD (Obst. & Gynecology) of Christian Medical College, Ludhiana along with the following legal opinion:-

"Under similar circumstances requests have been received by the Council for rejoining of candidates in MBBS and the Executive Committee in similar circumstances has allowed the candidates to rejoin the course after long gap. These decisions have been taken by the Executive Committee in its meeting under item no. 51 on 11.04.2017, item no. 9 on 11.07.2017, item no. 12 on 30.08.2017, item no. 16 on 30.08.2017, item no. 54 on 14.12.2017 and item no. 38 on 05.03.2018 which is kept on record.

It is also noted that the admission of these candidates would always relate that to the year of admission in which they have initially taken admission and would not be treated as an admission in the current academic year. Read: the matter with regard to readmission of Dr. A.B. Subha, MS Anatomy 1999-2000 candidate after a lapse of 14 years at the Tamil Nadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai, Academic wing along with the decision of the Sub-Committee dated 29/05/2018.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the matter with regard to readmission of Dr. A.B. Subha, MS Anatomy 1999-2000 candidate after a lapse of 14 years at the Tamil Nadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai, Academic wing along with the decision of the Sub-Committee dated 29/05/2018 and noted the following legal opinion:-

"Under similar circumstances requests have been received by the Council for rejoining of candidates in MBBS and the Executive Committee in similar circumstances has allowed the candidates to rejoin the course after long gap. These decisions have been taken by the Executive Committee in its meeting under item no. 51 on 11.04.2017, item no. 9 on 11.07.2017, item no. 12 on 30.08.2017, item no. 16 on 30.08.2017, item no. 54 on 14.12.2017 and item no. 38 on 05.03.2018 which is kept on record.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the matter with regard to condonation of break of study of Dr. Swapna K, DGO, Government Medical College, Thiruvananthapuram along with the decision of the Sub-Committee dated 29.05.2018 and noted the following legal opinion:-

"Under similar circumstances requests have been received by the Council for rejoining of candidates in MBBS and the Executive Committee in similar circumstances has allowed the candidates to rejoin the course after long gap. These decisions have been taken by the Executive Committee in its meeting under item no. 51 on 11.04.2017, item no. 9 on 11.07.2017, item no. 12 on 30.08.2017, item no. 16 on 30.08.2017, item no. 54 on 14.12.2017 and item no. 38 on 05.03.2018 which is kept on record.

It is also noted that the admission of these candidates would always relate that to the year of admission in which they have initially taken admission and would not be treated as an admission in the current academic year. Read: the letter dated 19.06.2018 received from the Registrar, The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai with regard to re-joining of Dr. C. Chellabaskar, MD (General Medicine) student at Madurai Medical College, Madurai under the Tamil Nadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the letter dated 19.06.2018 received from the Registrar, The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai with regard to re-joining of Dr. C. Chellabaskar, MD (General Medicine)

student at Madurai Medical College, Madurai under the Tamil Nadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai and noted that the duration of refresher course is the prerogative of the Institute/Govt. MCI is not concerned about it. This issue is not linked with his joining MD course in 1994 and failing in the examination.

In view of above, the Committee decided to allow the candidate to continue his/her study and he/she may be allowed for final examination after completion of course curriculum.

11. <u>Inclusion of DM in Pediatric Emergency & Intensive care in PG Regulations,</u> 2000 – Regarding.

Read: the matter with regard to preparing TEQ for DM (Paediatric Emergency & Intensive Care) alongwith recommendation of Academic Committee dated 05.2.2018 and Executive Committee dated 05.03.2018 and decision of the Sub-Committee dated 29.05.2018.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the matter with regard to preparing TEQ for DM (Paediatric Emergency & Intensive Care) alongwith recommendation of Academic Committee dated 05.2.2018 and Executive Committee dated 05.03.2018 and decision of the Sub-Committee dated 29.05.2018 and decided not to include DM Pediatric Emergency & Intensive Care in Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000. When the course is not included in regulations, there is no question of approval of TEQ(MSR)

12. <u>Inclusion of DM (Aviation Human Engineering) and DM (Environmental and Space Physiology) in Post Graduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000 – reg.</u>

Read: reconsider the letter dated 23/11/2017 received from the Central Government, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi forwarding therewith the letter dated 15/09/2017 received from the Air Chief Marshal BS Dhanoa and letter dated 27/10/2017 received from the Director General Medical Services (Air), Air Headquarters, New Delhi with regard to inclusion of DM (Aviation Human Engineering) and DM (Environmental and space Physiology) in the Schedule to PGMER, 2000 along with draft Guidelines & MSR of (a) DM in Aviation Human Engineering (b) DM in Environmental & Space Physiology as well as recommendations of the Sub-Committee dated 29/05/2018.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the reconsider the letter dated 23/11/2017 received from the Central Government, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi forwarding therewith the letter dated 15/09/2017 received from the Air Chief Marshal BS Dhanoa and letter dated 27/10/2017 received from the Director General Medical Services (Air), Air Headquarters, New Delhi with regard to inclusion of DM (Aviation Human Engineering) and DM (Environmental and space Physiology) in the Schedule to PGMER, 2000 along with draft Guidelines & MSR of (a) DM in Aviation Human Engineering (b) DM in Environmental &Space Physiology as well as recommendations of the Sub-Committee dated 29/05/2018 and the Committee observed as under:

A: D.M. (Environmental & Space Physiology)

(1) With regard to faculty requirement, it is proposed that professor should be from aviation medicine, Associate Professor should be form Physiology & there should be 1 Assistant Professor each from aviation medicine & physiology. Having a hierarchy structure different from other specialities would lead to several problems. This needs clarification.

- (2) Further regulations prescribe that faculty from feeder specialities should have special training in concerned super speciality for 2 years for a transit period of 10 years. Such a provision has not been made. It is required that feeder cadres be mentioned for faculty during this transit period.
- (3) Ancillary staff requirements include 3 trained medical assistants. However their qualifications, training etc are not prescribed. This needs elaboration.
- (4) It is also envisaged that training would include posting / training at International facilitates like NASA, European agency, Russian Agency. Such training at International agencies may not be feasible for all the candidates & may be impossible for Non Central Govt. institutes. Does it mean that this course is to be started at Central Govt. /Army institutes only and whether the institute will enter into an MOU with these agencies which will be submitted to MCI with request for LOP. This need clarification.

No reply has been given to the other <u>queries</u> raised by PG Committee in its meeting held on 07.03.2018. The item has been placed as before. Referred back to subcommittee for clarifications as sought above.

13. <u>Meeting of the Expert Group for M.Ch Hand Surgery held on 12.12.2017:</u> <u>submission of Guidelines, MSR & TEQ-reg.</u>

Read: the Guidelines, MSR & TEQ of M.Ch. (Hand Surgery) along with the recommendations of the meeting of the Expert Group of M.Ch. (Hand Surgery) and decision of the Sub-Committee dated 29.05.2018.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Guidelines, MSR & TEQ of M.Ch. (Hand Surgery) along with the recommendations of the meeting of the Expert Group of M.Ch. (Hand Surgery) and decision of the Sub-Committee dated 29.05.2018 and decided that a separate meeting of the Postgraduate Committee may be called for discussion on item No.13, 14, 17, 19, 20, 21, 22, 26.

The Committee further decided that no other item be included in that meeting.

14. <u>Meeting of the Expert Group for DM in Paediatric Nephrology held on</u> 22.11.2017 – submission of Guidelines, MSR & TEQ – regarding.

Read: the Guidelines, MSR & TEQ of DM in Paediatric Nephrology along with the recommendations dated 22/11/2017 of the meeting of the Expert Group and the decision of the Sub-Committee dated 29.05.2018.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Guidelines, MSR & TEQ of DM in Paediatric Nephrology along with the recommendations dated 22/11/2017 of the meeting of the Expert Group and the decision of the Sub-Committee dated 29.05.2018 and decision is the same as item 13. The course is yet not included in PG Regulations, there is no question approval of TEQ/MSR.

15. Meeting of Expert group to examine letter from Chairman, Atomic Energy Regulatory Board (AERB) regarding inclusion of Radiation safety syllabus in concerned medical specialties was held on 21st February, 2018 & decision of EC meeting held on 05-03-2018 – reg.

Read: the matter with regard to inclusion of Radiation safety syllabus in concerned medical specialties along with the recommendations of the Expert Group dated 21/02/2018 to examine letter from Chairman, Atomic Energy Regulatory Board (AERB) and the decision of the Executive Committee dated 05/03/2018 as well as recommendations of the Academic Committee dated 29/05/2018.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the matter with regard to inclusion of Radiation safety syllabus in concerned medical specialties along with the recommendations of the Expert Group dated 21/02/2018 to examine letter from Chairman, Atomic Energy Regulatory Board (AERB) and the decision of the Executive Committee dated 05/03/2018 as well as recommendations of the Academic Committee dated 29/05/2018 and noted that the matter is already approved by Executive Committee. There is no need to seeking permission from PG Committee for sending information to Chairman Atomic Energy Regulatory Boards(AERB).

16. Reg. OFAMOS effective implementation.

Read: action the matter with regard to effective implementation of the OFAMOS.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the action in the matter with regard to effective implementation of the OFAMOS and decided to seek the following clarifications from concerned section:

- (i) Why Senior & Junior residents have be excluded from OFAMOS Attendance.
- (ii) A major chunk of 10(A) assessments have already been done for the Academic Year 2019-20. Whether this clause should be inserted in SAF at this stage or from next session.

17. Representation received from the Vice Chancellor, Pt. Deendayal Upadhyay memorial Health Sciences and Ayush university Chhatisgarh, Raipur. Representation dated 28.03.2018 (Received on 20.04.2018). R.No. OC2/2018/713 dated 20.04.2018.

Read: the representation dated 28/03/2018 received from the Vice Chancellor, Pt. Deendayal Upadhyay memorial Health Sciences and Ayush university Chhatisgarh, Raipur through the Secretary, Oversight Committee vide letter dated 23/04/2018 as well as recommendations of the Academic Committee dated 29/05/2018.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the representation dated 28/03/2018 received from the Vice Chancellor, Pt. Deendayal Upadhyay memorial Health Sciences and Ayush University Chhatisgarh, Raipur through the Secretary, Oversight Committee vide letter dated 23/04/2018 as well as recommendations of the Academic Committee dated 29/05/2018 and decision is the same as item 13.

18. <u>Clarification sought by the Director of Medical Education, Tripura whether designated faculties may be accepted by MCI during inspection – regarding.</u>

Matter pertains to amendments to PG regulations like deletion of certain courses which are no longer conducted, etc.

Members of PG Committee observed that one of the proposals is with regard to units of clinical departments which reads as under:

"The Units in Board speciality clinical departments are required as per PG Regulations, 2000". As no details are provided, it is not clear what amendment is required & for what purpose. Hence PG section is directed to resubmit the same with full details.

Regarding deletion of various diploma courses mentioned therein, it is observed that diploma courses are different from DM courses and are independent from one another. If diploma & degree courses in broad specialities can co-exist, there is no justifiable reason why diploma and DM courses cannot co-exist. Hence the PG section is directed to ascertain from all institutes whether these courses are presently conducted or not, whether they had been conducted at any time in the past, whether any students were admitted in such courses and their status regarding passing the examination and submit a comprehensive report on the same.

- 4. The college has been permitted 150 seats in 2017. Resultantly, the total beds required are 138. However, there are only 120 beds available.
- 5. Equipment like Holter are not available.
- 6. MRI is not available.
- 7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

- 3. Yoga Laboratory is not available.
- 4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 3(Three) till renewal of their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. - 3. Facilities are inadequate in OPD, wards.
- 4. Recent editions of Textbooks are not available in Departmental Library.
- 5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

83. <u>Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh - Renewal of recognition of MD(General Medicine) qualification for 10 seats in respect of students being trained at Kamineni Institute of Medical Sciences, Narketpally - Telangana.</u>

Read: the Assessment Report (12.05.2018) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Kamineni Institute of Medical Sciences, Narketpally for purpose of Renewal of recognition of MD(General Medicine) qualification for 10 seats granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Assessment Report (12.05.2018) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that the recognition of MD(General Medicine) qualification for 10 seats granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh in respect of students being trained at Kamineni Institute of Medical Sciences, Narketpally be renewed.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

84. <u>Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh - Renewal of recognition of MS(General Surgery) qualification for 10 seats in respect of students being trained at Kamineni Institute of Medical Sciences, Narketpally.</u>

Read: the Compliance verification Report (23.07.2018) and Council Assessor's Report(s) (19.01.2018 & June, 2017) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available for Renewal of recognition of MS(General Surgery) qualification for 10 seats in respect of students being trained at Kamineni Institute of Medical Sciences, Narketpally granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, A.P.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance verification Report (23.07.2018) and Council Assessor's Report(s) (19.01.2018 & June, 2017) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that the recognition of MS(General Surgery) qualification for 10 seats granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh in respect of students being trained at Kamineni Institute of Medical Sciences, Narketpally be renewed.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

85. Rajasthan University of Health Sciences, Jaipur - Recognition of MD(Transfusion Medicine) qualification for 2 seats in respect of students being trained at R N T Medical College, Udaipur.

Read: the Compliance verification Report (09.07.2018) and Council Assessor's Report(s) (August, 2015) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available for Recognition of MD(Transfusion Medicine) qualification for 2 seats at R.N.T. Medical College, Udaipur granted by Rajasthan University of Health Sciences, Jaipur.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance verification Report (09.07.2018) and Council Assessor's Report(s) (August, 2015) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(Transfusion Medicine) qualification for 2 seats granted by Rajasthan University of Health Sciences, Jaipur in respect of students being trained at R.N.T. Medical College, Udaipur be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

86. Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur - Recognition of MS(Orthopaedics) qualification for 1 seat in respect of students being trained at T.D. Medical College, Alappuzha.

Read: the Court order 25.06.2018 alongwith college representations dated 22.05.2018 and 04.07.2018 for correction in the date of Recognition of MS(Orthopaedics) qualification for 1 seat in respect of students being trained at T.D. Medical College, Alappuzha granted by Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Court order 25.06.2018 alongwith college representations dated 22.05.2018 and 04.07.2018 and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MS(Orthopaedics) qualification for 1 seat be granted by Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur in respect of students being trained at T.D. Medical College, Alappuzha be recognized from 2014 instead of 2016.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

87. <u>University of Kerala, Recognition of DM(Nephrology) qualification at T.D. Medical College, Alappuzha (Kerala) under section 11(2) of the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956.</u>

Read: the Court order 17.07.2018 writ petition dated 28.09.2013 for Recogntion of DM(Nephrology) qualification in respect of students being trained at T.D. Medical College, Alappuzha granted by University of Kerala.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee on perusal of order dated 27.05.2015 in W.P.C No.23576/2013 – Dr. J. Gomathy Vs. State of Kerala & Ors. and order dated 03.07.2018 in WA No.1493/2013 in MCI Vs. Dr. S. Gomathy & Ors. and noted that the matter relates to seeking recognition of DM(Nephrology) qualification of Govt. Medical College, Thiruvananthpuram w.e.f.1998 i.e. the year in which Dr. S.Gomathy had passed out. The qualification as on date is recognized only in respect of students who have joined the course only after 1999.

The Postgraduate Committee observed that neither MCI was informed when admission was done nor when the course was discontinued. No request was ever made for recognition of the degree u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act. The office has informed that there is no record of any kind in MCI office for DM(Nephrology) from 1996-98 in this college.

In view of the orders of the Hon'ble High Court, the Committee decided to seek legal opinion of Law Officer.

88. <u>Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur - Recognition of MD(Radio-diagnosis) qualification for 2 seats in respect of students being trained at Regional Cancer Centre, Thiruvanthapuram.</u>

Read: letter dated 04.07.2018 received from Director, Regional Cancer Centre, Thiruvanthapuram alongwith court order dated 10.07.2018 received from Legal Section Compliance Verification Assessment Report (21.10.2016) and previous assessment reports (March, 2016) & (June, 2015) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available for Recognition of MD(Radio-diagnosis) qualification for 2 seats in respect of students being trained at Regional Cancer Centre, Thiruvanthapuram granted by Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the letter dated 04.07.2018 received from Director, Regional Cancer Centre, Thiruvanthapuram alongwith court order dated 10.07.2018 received from Legal Section Compliance Verification Assessment Report (21.10.2016) and previous assessment reports (March, 2016) & (June, 2015 and noted that as per notification dated 04.04.2018. The Committee also noted that the college has intimated that the admission has been stopped after the 4th batch.

The college is entitled to be recognized for first 4 batches of MD(Radio-Diagnosis) course. However, the Letter of Permission granted for the course will lapse after that. The college will not admit any students after the 4th batch unless they apply a fresh application under Section 10(A) and seek fresh letter of Permission. Hence the Postgraduate Committee decided that the first 4th batch be recognized. Accordingly, the PG Committee decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(Radio-diagnosis) qualification for 2 seats granted by Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur in respect of students being trained at Regional Cancer Centre, Thiruvanthapuram be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956 in respect of batches admitted for the academic years 2012-13, 2013-14, 2014-15 and 2015-16, after this the course should be deleted from the Schedule.

89. Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore - Recognition/Renewal of recognition of DMRD qualification for 02 seats (as informed by college authorities) in respect of students being trained at Vijaynagar Institute of Medical Sciences, Bellary - Karnataka.

Read: the Assessment Report (07.06.2018) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Vijaynagar Institute of Medical Sciences, Bellary for purpose of Recognition/Renewal of recognition of DMRD qualification for 02 seats (as informed by college authorities) granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Assessment Report (07.06.2018) and decided to recommend not to recognize/renew DMRD qualification for 02 seats (as informed by college authorities) granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore in respect of students being trained at Vijaynagar Institute of Medical Sciences, Bellary because of the following facts:-

- 1. There is no Professor.
- 2. Deficiency of faculty: (a) Professor: 1; (b) Assoc. Prof.: 1; (c) Asst. Prof.: 2.
- 3. Shortage of Senior Residents: 1.
- 4. Promotion of Dr. Sadashiva Gowda H, Assoc.Prof., is not as per regulations. He was Asst.prof. for 4 years 3 months and promoted Assoc.prof. without the required 2 publications.
- 5. MRI is not available.
- 6. 4 Static X-ray machines are available against requirement of 6.
- 7. 3 Mobile X-ray machines are available against requirement of 6.
- 8. Mammography is not available.
- 9. DSA is not available.
- 10. Workload of CT guided FNAC was NIL on day of assessment as well as on randomly selected days.
- 11. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 2 after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office within 30 days from the date of communication of the deficiencies by the Council as specified in the Gazette Notification dated 05.11.2018. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

Note: The Postgraduate Committee was informed that a CW(P) has been filed but no roder are available.

90. <u>Veer Narmad South Gujarat University - Recognition of MS(Emergency Medicine) qualification for 02 seats in respect of students being trained at Government Medical College, Surat.</u>

Read: Compliance Verification Assessment Report (08.02.2018) and previous assessment report (June, 2017) and the letters dated 06.07.2018 & 13.07.2018 received from the Secretary, Oversight Committee on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Government Medical College, Surat for purpose of Recognition of MS(Emergency Medicine) qualification for 02 seats granted by Veer Narmad South Gujarat University.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (08.02.2018) and previous assessment report (June, 2017) and the letters dated 06.07.2018 & 13.07.2018 received from the Secretary, Oversight Committee and decided to recommend not to recognize MS(Emergency Medicine) qualification for 02 seats granted by Veer Narmad South Gujarat University in respect of students being trained at Government Medical College, Surat because of the following facts:-

- 1. Dr. P.B. Gupta, Professor, was not available on the day of assessment.
- 2. With regard to Dr. Praveen Sharma, he was posted as Assoc. Prof. of Emergency Medicine straightaway from the post of Asso. Prof. of General Surgery without any experience or trining in Emergency Medicine on 27/09/2011. The contention of the Institute that he has received training in Emergency Medicine in this department as faculty fom 2011 to 2014 cannot be considered. Further he has been shown as Asso. Prof. of General Surgery at Govt. Medical College, Vadodara from 21/02/2014 to 08/03/2017 & then again as Associate Professor of Emergency Medicine at this Institute w.e.f. 08/03/2017 till date.
- 3. Dr. Dimple Patel, Asst. Prof. has been transferred from the post of Asst. Prof. of General Surgery on 11/07/2017 without having any formal qualification or training in Emergency Medicine as such; hence she cannot be considered.
- 4. Resultantly there is no faculty who is eligible.
- 5. There is no Senior Resident.
- 6. Data of Clinical material provided pertain to the whole hospital & not of Emergency Medicine department.
- 7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 2(Two) after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office within 30 days from the date of communication of the deficiencies by the Council as specified in the Gazette Notification dated 05.11.2018. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

91. Bundelkhand University - Recognition of MS(General Surgery) qualification for 2 seats and Renewal of recognition for 4 seats in respect of students being trained at M.L.B. Medical College, Jhansi.

Read: the letter No. OC2/PG-MCI/MLB MED College, Jhansi-MS(Gen. Sur) /2018/074 d. No. OC2/2018/1068-69, Dated 28.06.2018 received from Dr. Sanjay Srivastrava Secretary OC with regard to Recognition of MS(General Surgery) qualification for 2 seats and Renewal of recognition for 4 seats in respect of students being trained at M.L.B. Medical College, Jhansi granted by Bundelkhand University.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the letter No. OC2/PG-MCI/MLB MED College, Jhansi-MS(Gen. Sur) /2018/074 d. No. OC2/2018/1068-69, Dated 28.06.2018 received from Dr. Sanjay Srivastrava Secretary OC and noted that as per MCI website 6 seats of MS(General Surgery) are recognized and decided that no further action is required.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee also decided to recommend to the Central Government that the recognition of MS(General Surgery) qualification for 6(Six) seats granted by Bundelkhand University in respect of students being trained at M.L.B. Medical College, Jhansi be renewed.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

92. North-Eastern Hill University - Recognition of MS(General Surgery) qualification for 2 seats in respect of students being trained at North Eastern Indira Gandhi Regional Institute of Health & Medical Sciences, Shillong.

Read: the Legal Opinion and representations of passed out students, Compliance Verification Assessment Report (March, 2017) and previous assessment report (April, 2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available for Recognition of MS(General Surgery) qualification for 2 seats in respect of students being trained at North Eastern Indira Gandhi Regional Institute of Health & Medical Sciences, Shillong granted by North-Eastern Hill University.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Legal Opinion and representations of passed out students, Compliance Verification Assessment Report (March, 2017) and previous assessment report (April, 2016) and noted that this is a Central Govt. institute and Letter of Permission was granted by the Central Government on 07.04.2010 subject to the condition of joining of a Processor in the department, before the start of course.

The recognition assessment was done for the first time on 28.04.2016 after a gap of 6 years. The college did not apply before that when the first batch appeared in the examination. There were multiple deficiencies found. First compliance verification assessment was done on 07.03.2017 in which also multiple deficiencies were found. After that the college has not submitted any compliance.

The Postgraduate Committee decided to refer the matter to the Central Govt. for taking appropriate decision for recognition of MS(General Surgery) qualification for 2 seats in respect of students being trained at North Eastern Indira Gandhi Regional Institute of Health & Medical Sciences, Shillong granted by North-Eastern Hill University admitted till date and continuation of the course for future.

93. <u>Dr. NTR. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada - Recognition of DCP qualification 02 seats in respect of students being trained at Kamineni Institute of Medical Sciences, Narketpally.</u>

Read: the Compliance verification Report (23.07.2018) and Council Assessor's Report(s) (February, 2018 & May, 2014) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available for Recognition of DCP qualification 02 seats in respect of students being trained at Kamineni Institute of Medical Sciences, Narketpally granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance verification Report (23.07.2018) and Council Assessor's Report(s) (Feb., 2018 & May, 2014) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that DCP qualification 02 seats granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh in respect of students being trained at Kamineni Institute of Medical Sciences, Narketpally be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

94. Increase of seats in MS (Orthopaedics) course at Sree Balaji Medical College and Hospital, Chennai, Tamilnadu under Bharath Institute of Higher Education & Research (Deemed Univ.), Chennai U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2019-20.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (24th July 2018) for Increase of seats in MS (Orthopaedics) course at Sree Balaji Medical College and Hospital, Chennai, Tamilnadu under Bharath Institute of Higher Education & Research (Deemed Univ.), Chennai U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2019-20.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (24th July 2018) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for Increase of seats in MS (Orthopaedics) course at Sree Balaji Medical College and Hospital, Chennai, Tamilnadu under Bharath Institute of Higher Education & Research (Deemed Univ.), Chennai u/s 10A of the I.M.C. Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2019-20 from 10(Ten) to 15(Fifteen) students per year till the first batch admitted against the increased number appears in the final examination of the said course. Read: the Council Assessor's Report (24th July 2018) for Increase of seats in MS (General Surgery) course at Sree Balaji Medical College and Hospital, Chennai, Tamilnadu under Bharath Institute of Higher Education & Research (Deemed Univ.), Chennai U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2019-20.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (24th July 2018) for Increase of seats in MD (Respiratory Medicine) course at Sree Balaji Medical College and Hospital, Chennai, Tamilnadu under Bharath Institute of Higher Education & Research (Deemed Univ.), Chennai U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2019-20.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (24th July 2018) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for Increase of seats in MD (Respiratory Medicine) course at Sree Balaji Medical College and Hospital, Chennai, Tamilnadu under Bharath Institute of Higher Education & Research (Deemed Univ.), Chennai u/s 10A of the I.M.C. Read: the Council Assessor's Report (24th July 2018) for Increase of seats in MD (Dermatology, Venereology & Leprosy) course at Sree Balaji Medical College and Hospital, Chennai, Tamilnadu under Bharath Institute of Higher Education & Research (Deemed Univ.), Chennai U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2019-20.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the matter with regard to Increase of seats in various Postgraduate Courses at Alluri Sitaram Raju Academy of Medical Sciences, Eluru under NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijaywada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2019-20 in lieu of surrender of diploma seats and noted the matter pertains to surrender of diploma seats for conversion into degree seats.

The members of the PG Committee observed that institution was running the said Diploma courses with prior permission of the Central Government pursuant to recommendations of MCI upon their application. Further these courses are already recognized u/s 11(2) of IMC Act. Present request is only for surrender of these Recognized Diploma seats in lieu of equal number of Degree seats wherein no additional seat is being granted to the Institute.

In view of above and as per resolution of the General Body dated 23.03.2018 and Gazette notification dt. 12.07.2018 it was decided to recommend that diploma seats which are recognized, surrendered and deletion of these diplomas are notified by the Central Government be converted into Degree seats as requested by the Institute for the academic year 2019-20 as under:-
