Subject: Transfer of faculty at the time of assessment-Govt. Colleges regarding.

Sir/Madam,

This is to inform you that in discharge of its statutory function to maintain minimum standards of medical education at both the Undergraduate and Postgraduate levels, the Medical Council of India in order to verify the teaching faculty, residents, clinical material and other infrastructural facilities, carries out the following assessments for :-

- i) Establishment of New Medical Colleges
- ii) Increase in seats in MBBS course
- iii) Starting of New Courses including PG and Higher Courses and any increase in such courses; and
- iv) Continuance of recognition
- v) Pre PG assessment

Even after surprise assessments of the Medical Colleges/ Institutions, this Council has been receiving a large number of complaints highlighting the deficiencies in these colleges, especially relating to shortage of faculty, in spite of undertaking given by the Health Secretaries of the concerned State. On monitoring of the deficiencies it has been found that the faculty deficiencies still remains more than 10%.

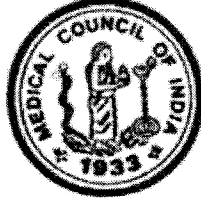
It is also to bring to your kind notice that the Council has further reduced the requirement of teaching faculty as per amendment made in July, 2015.

However, it is still observed that several faculty members are found working at two different colleges at the same time. On detailed scrutiny, it was found that majority of cases were of faculty working in Govt. college that were transferred solely for showing adequate staff strength for the purpose of assessment.

As regards the faculty, such violation attracts action under the "Indian Medical Council (Professional Conduct, Etiquette and Ethics) Regulations, 2002" while for the Medical

Colleges/Institutions, action can be initiated in terms of "Establishment of Medical College Regulation (Amendment) 2010, Part - II, dated 16.04.2011, which reads as under:-

"(d) Colleges which are found to have employed teachers with faked/forged documents:

If it is observed that any institute is found to have employed a teacher with faked/forged documents and have submitted the Declaration Form of such a teacher, such an institute will not be considered for renewal of permission/recognition for award of M.B.B.S degree/processing the applications for postgraduate courses for two Academic Years - i.e. that Academic Year and the next Academic Year and the next Academic Year also.

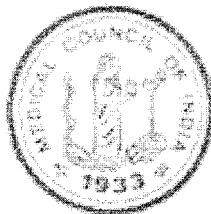
I am therefore, directed to inform you that a faculty transferred to any other college/institution would be counted at only one institute for the said academic session and no faculty should be transferred from one medical college to another medical college solely for assessment purpose.

Sub.:- Evaluation of standards of examination by the visitor in his visitation report.

Sir/ Madam,

I am directed to inform you that the matter with regard to evaluation of standards of examination by the visitor in his visitation report was considered by the General Body at its meeting held on 26th & 27th March, 2015, and it was decided as under:-

"The Council approved that the inspection for recognition of MBBS qualification of any college conducted by the Council u/s 11(2) of I.M.C. Act, 1956 should be split into two independent parts – i) to evaluate the process of conduct of examination by the examining university; ii) compliance to Minimum Standard Requirements as prescribed by the Council for the award of recognition, to be carried out separately by two different set of Inspectors at two different points of time separated by a gap of minimum 30 days (One month).

The Council also approved that the additional criteria for evaluating the standards for conduct of university examination would include the following:-

- Syllabus prescribed by the examining university for the concerned course alongwith date of effectivity.*
- Governing by law/ordinance pertaining to the examination notified by the examining university and its date of effect.*
- Standard of question papers set out for the said examination in the context of they being commensurate with the prescribed syllabus.*
- Scheme of setting, moderation of the question papers and assessment of the answer books as prescribed by the examining university.*
- Scheme of conduct of practical, clinical & viva-voce examination prescribed by the examining university.*
- Conformity of the syllabus and scheme of examination prescribed by the examining university with the one prescribed by the Council in its Governing Regulation.*
